










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EVOLV3 ENGINEERING





On Wednesday, 21st February 2024, 20 of our KS4 & 5 students attended an EVOLV3 Engineering trip to the Dry Dock World shipyard.

This innovative and extraordinary trip was the brainchild of Iva Rankovic, a Year 12 academic scholar with a deep passion for engineering. Inspired by her father, an esteemed engineer working in quality control at the Dry Docks World Shipyards, Iva envisioned this trip as a golden opportunity for her peers to gain firsthand insight and experience into the real world of engineering.

Her initiative perfectly aligns with the EVOLV3 programme ethos of fostering curiosity and providing practical learning experiences beyond the classroom environment.

lva's proactive approach and desire to share her personal connection to the engineering field have not only enriched her peers' understanding but have also served as a testament to the invaluable learning that arises from bridging academic pursuits with real-world applications.

Through Iva's vision, students were afforded a unique glimpse into the professional realm of engineering, transforming theoretical knowledge into tangible experiences.

This well-designed programme was tailored for our Year 11 to Year 13 students, who hold a keen interest in STEM and are contemplating careers in engineering.
